What is CELT-S?	<i>CELT-S</i> is a qualification designed for English language teachers working in secondary education (ages 11-18).
What are the aims of CELT-S?	<p><i>CELT-S</i> aims to help participants improve the quality of their classroom practice by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ developing and extending teachers' knowledge and skills; ▪ focusing on the strategies, methods and materials teachers need to teach language effectively; ▪ helping teachers to manage and motivate large classes; and ▪ providing teachers with strategies to ensure that all learners achieve their potential.
How will CELT-S be conducted?	<i>CELT-S</i> is a 150-hour blended learning course, comprising eight modules (see Course Syllabus for details) and a practical component (comprising portfolio tasks and teaching observations).
What is the timeframe and nature of the course?	<p><i>CELT-S</i> will be conducted in four phases. They are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ <u>Phase 1: 22 July to 3 November 2019 (60 hours)</u> Orientation Webinars 15-week online learning phase Complete 4 modules with at least 60 hours of online study. ▪ <u>Phase 2: 5 to 22 November 2019 (60 hours of contact time)</u> 3-week residential training in Singapore at SEAMEO RELC <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete 2 face-to-face modules and seminars (54 hours) • *TP1: 6 hours of micro-teaching and peer observation • TKT (Module 1) will be taken on 22 November 2019 in Singapore. ▪ <u>Phase 3: 2 December 2019 to 26 January 2020 (30 hours)</u> 8-week online learning phase Complete 2 modules with at least 30 hours of online study

<p>What will the participants receive at the end of the course?</p>	<p>Course participants who complete all the modules and assessments will receive the <i>CELT-S</i> qualification from Cambridge Assessment English, a Certificate for TKT (Module 1) and a Certificate of Achievement from SEAMEO RELC.</p> <p>The <i>CELT-S</i> qualification is awarded with a Pass or Pass with Merit.</p>

- Medical Examination Form A228
- Copies of your certificates of degrees/diplomas, certified by your institution
- Copies of your transcripts, certified by your institution. Where a transcript is in a language other than English, it should be accompanied by a certified translation into English. (In the absence of a transcript, a certified statement on the degrees/academic qualifications achieved with a listing of subjects studied and subject examination results is required.)
- Reference letters (The two reference letters can be from an academic staff who has supervised you or a current/previous employer.)
- Copies of current/valid IELTS or official TOEFL results certified by your institution (for applicants from non-English medium education systems)
